From the Minister –



We may be right smack in the middle of Lent, but I would like to take a moment to give a shout out to The First Church Women's Club, who will be celebrating their 100th anniversary April 24 (Easter Day). This group which has met on the second Tuesday of each month since 1911 was first formed when seven women met in the home of Mrs. Edgar D. Clark to organize The Women's Club of the First Church. Its stated purpose was "To promote a spirit of sociability and helpfulness in the parish."

As we look back on their 100-year-old history there can no question that this group has remained faithful to the original goal of their mission. Meetings were initially held twice a month, followed by tea until 1940. Each year it was the custom of the Women's Club to sponsor an annual fair but food and rummage sales were also popular ways of raising money over the years. In 1927 the fair raised \$1300. The women were so pleased with their fundraising success that they voted to have the treasurer's report printed in the local paper!

That the Women's Club has been instrumental in promoting an atmosphere of "sociability" over the years there can be no doubt, but the group's success has also been characterized by a spirit of generosity as well. In addition to donating funds to help maintain the buildings and grounds, they have also supported such missions as sending Care packages to Ellis Island and supporting the Save-the-Children Federation, as well as collecting magazines for the state prison in Wethersfield, sending vitamins to lepers in India, and donating money to victims of the 1926 hurricane in Miami. Moreover, in 1919, in the interests of world peace, they voted to support the League of Nations, and in 1932 they sent a "letter of encouragement" to Miss Mary Wooley, U.S. Representative at the World Disarmament Conference in Geneva.

The same spirit of helpfulness and generosity that characterized the group in the past continues to remain a hallmark of the organization today. In recent years they have raised money for Silver Lake scholarships, purchased a new desk for the minister's office, and helped to redecorate the Morrell Room. But perhaps their most enduring and significant ministry has been to provide receptions in Nelson Hall following funeral and memorial services.

While every woman in the church is technically a member of The First Church Women's Club, they recognize that in this day and age it simply isn't possible for most working women to attend a monthly mid-week luncheon. Nevertheless, there are many other ways the women of the church can participate, and of course, new members are always welcome.

Although the actual date of their 100th anniversary is April 24, The Women's Club has issued an invitation to every woman in the church to attend their Gala Luncheon April 12 at noon in Nelson Hall. 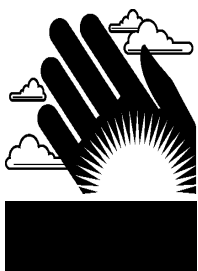

The church's five-year contract had neared its end so a search was begun to look for a new lease and possibly a new servicing company. After interviewing companies and checking references, both the church and the Early Learning Center decided to move to DeRenzy Solutions, a woman-owned company that has been in business since 1972. Their focus is on smaller companies and not-for-profits. We signed new leases; the church lease payment is less than our previous payment plus the servicing cost will be reduced significantly. We also received three months free service and have the ability to make color copies. A win-win situation to be sure!

Russell House



During the month of February, a special committee was formed to study the Russell House issue. Barry Budlong is chairman with Al

Boehm, Randy Clark, Jan Stevens (members at large), Rick Huleatt (Minister), Aubrey Loomis (Church Treasurer), and Doug Kelly (representing the Prudential Board.) In the first week of our existence, we partnered with the Windsor Historical Society to write an application for a Historic Preservation Technical Assistance Grant (HPTAG). By the end of the week, we had completed the application, found an architect with the special team needed for the study and had been approved for the grant. God does work in mysterious ways! This study will assess the current condition of the Russell House and determine the types of repairs needed and their costs.

The final report of this study will be issued sometime in the fall of 2011. Because this house is of historical significance and in the historic district, the process and our church's decision are bound by a number of rules and laws at the local, state and national levels. Three of our buildings (Russell house, Pierson house, and Parish house) are situated on two lots so we are doing research on that puzzle with some pro bono help from Diane Whitney of Pullman and Comley. Currently, we have more questions than answers, but we are working diligently to clarify our congregation's options with their pros and cons. We will keep everyone updated with articles and informational meetings. For an interesting overview of the Russell house's history and why it is deemed significant, see the newsletter prepared by our neighbor, the Windsor Historical Society. Copies will be available for pick up after church services.
